

**SEPTEMBER CALL¹ FOR ADMISSION TO THE JOINT MASTER'S DEGREE IN HEALTH
INFORMATICS
ACADEMIC YEAR 2026/2027**

Article 1 – New admission test for the academic year 2026/2027

The second admission test for the academic year 2026/2027 for access to the jointly awarded Master's Degree Programme in Health Informatics will take place on 5 September 2026.

Article 2 – Number of places available

The Master's Degree in Health Informatics is jointly offered by Politecnico di Milano and Università Vita-Salute San Raffaele.

For the September intake of the academic year 2026/2027, the number of available places is 22, of which 4 are reserved for non-EU citizens, in accordance with Article 2 of Italian Law No. 264/1999.

Article 3 – Citizenship and academic requirements

Only candidates who meet the citizenship and academic requirements as described in articles 3.1, 3.2 and 3.4 of this Call will be admitted to the test.

3.1 Definition of the EU quota

Italian citizens, EU citizens² wherever residing and non-European citizens with EU equal status fall under the EU quota, as indicated by the Ministerial Circular of April 1, 2025, named "Procedures for entry, residency and enrolment of international students and the respective recognition of qualifications for higher education courses in Italy valid for the academic year 2025/2026" and subsequent modifications and additions, available on the official webpage of the MUR website: <https://www.studiare-in-italia.it/studentistranieri/>.

3.2 Definition of the Non-EU quota

Non-EU citizens who do not already reside in Italy and do not have any second European citizenship or European permanent residence permit compete for the non-EU quota.

3.3 – Admission requirements

Applicants who meet the requirements set out in the previous Call for Admission may enrol in the programme only after successfully completing an admission procedure consisting of two stages:

1. A test to assess basic knowledge in computer science, mathematics, biology, genetics, anatomy, and physiology
2. An evaluation of the applicant's academic record achieved during the Bachelor's degree programme and of their adequate preparation to undertake the subjects specific to the Master's degree programme.

Please note that the programme is taught entirely in English; therefore, no Italian language proficiency test is required.

3.4 Academic requirements

In order to participate in the selection process, candidates as described in the articles 3.1 and 3.2 must have achieved or will achieve **by the a.y. 2025/2026 Fall session**:

1. A degree in one of the following classes: L2 – Biotechnology; L8 – Information Engineering; L13 – Biological Sciences; L31– Information Sciences and Technologies; LM41 – Medicine and Surgery
Or
2. At least a three-year degree or a degree acquired through the completion of minimum 180 ECTS, where the following credits have been obtained:
 - 21 credits acquired in the sectors INF/01, ING-INF/05
Or
 - 21 credits acquired in the sectors BIO/09, BIO/13, BIO/16

In the absence of the above conditions, the Commission will evaluate eligibility for the competition by considering the list of exams taken and the related course syllabi that the candidate must upload during registration on the UniSR Admission Portal. This evaluation will be carried out before completing the registration for the admission test, and the

outcome regarding the possibility of completing the registration for the competition will be communicated in time to complete the procedure as set forth in this Call.

3.5 Foreign qualification

Candidates having a non-Italian qualification or attending an international/non-Italian college are invited to consult the documents published on the University's website at <https://www.unisr.it/en/servizi/ammissioni/titoli-esteri> for detailed information on the academic requirements to access university courses in Italy.

The Admissions & Credential Evaluation Office will carry out a preliminary check of the school documents to determine whether the academic requirements for enrolment in the Course are met. The Admissions & Credential Evaluation Office reserves the right to verify the suitability of both the qualification and the entire school career for the purposes of access and eligibility to university courses in compliance with the procedures and current Italian legislation. **The verification of the entrance qualification will be completed during the enrolment phase.** Candidates who, at the time of enrolment, do not possess a suitable qualification or scholastic path, as described in this article, lose the right to enrol and the benefits deriving from the position achieved in the ranking list.

The same criteria indicated in the art. 3.4 also apply to those who hold a university degree obtained abroad, deemed suitable by the Admission and Academic Committee. If the disciplinary sectors are not identifiable, the Academic Committee will proceed with the evaluation of the career based on the verification of the programs of the exams taken that the candidate must upload during registration on the UniSR Admission Portal. This evaluation will be carried out before completing the registration for the admission test, and the outcome regarding the possibility of completing the registration for the competition will be communicated in time to complete the procedure as set forth in this Call.

Article 3 – Registration for the admission test

Online registration for the second admission test for access to the jointly awarded Master's Degree Programme in Health Informatics, taught in English, will open upon publication of this Rector's Decree and will close on 28 August 2026 at 12:00 CEST, according to the procedures set out in the admission call issued by Rector's Decree No. 9851 of 15 December 2025, to which full reference is made.

3.1 – Admission test procedures

The second admission test will be carried out exclusively in home-based mode, from a workstation available to the candidate, through a remote proctoring platform.

Starting from the fifth day prior to the beginning of the test sessions, all candidates will receive, from the email address convocazioni@ilmiotest.it, at the email address provided during the registration of their personal details, the instructions for taking the test, including the procedures to verify the required technical requirements.

3.2 – Test content

The admission test consists of a multiple-choice questionnaire comprising 24 questions, each with 4 possible answers, divided as follows:

- 8 questions on mathematics;
- 8 questions on computer science;
- 2 questions on biology;
- 2 questions on genetics;
- 2 questions on anatomy;
- 2 questions on physiology.

The questions listed above will be provided in English.

Candidates will have a total of 60 minutes to complete the test.

3.2 – Evaluation of academic carrier

Evaluation of the academic career will be based of the weighted average grade obtained in the examinations taken during the first-level university degree programme, considering all examinations except those for which only eligibility is awarded (a grade of 30 cum laude will be considered as 31).

For the purposes of the above, during the registration procedure, candidates must upload the degree certificate or enrolment certificate including the list of examinations taken, the corresponding grades, and ECTS credits (self-certification, where applicable, pursuant to Article 46 of Italian Presidential Decree No. 445/2000).

Candidates enrolled in a foreign degree programme or holding a qualification obtained abroad must upload a certificate issued by the competent academic authority – endorsed by the relevant diplomatic representation in the country concerned – certifying the examinations passed, together with detailed syllabi of the educational activities for each subject.

All candidates are also required to upload:

- an Excel file containing the list of examinations taken, grades obtained, and ECTS credits (the template is available on the University website at: www.unisr.it/servizi/ammissioni/health-informatics);
- a brief curricular and motivational self-presentation, for information purposes only and not subject to evaluation.

Article 4 – Admission for enrolment

Candidates who are placed in a position eligible for admission in the ranking list must proceed with enrolment according to the procedures set out in the previous call for admissions. Candidates shall access the relevant section of the website using the credentials obtained during the registration process and follow the instructions officially published by the Admissions & Credential Evaluation Office on the University website at: www.unisr.it/servizi/immatricolazioni/health-informatics.

Enrolment procedures will be open from the date of publication of the ranking list (within 15 days from the date of the test) until 12:00 noon on the third working day thereafter, according to the procedures described at: www.unisr.it/servizi/immatricolazioni/health-informatics.
